We finally have the documentation to prove what we as the community of Building Trade Contractors have been sure of for many years. By having contracts awarded to local firms who have invested to be the safest in their field and employ local talent that are infused with the culture of safe work, they will have safer and more productive projects which will strengthen our Southern Ontario economy."
