Leveraging the recently released <u>study</u> led by the Institute for Work and Health, which found that unionized construction sites in Ontario's ICI construction sector are 31% safer when compared to non-unionized sites, MCAHN and UA Local 67 engaged in a regional publicity campaign to help communicate these findings, showcasing how unionized mechanical contractors adapted to new COVID-19 protocols to keep work sites safe.

As part of the campaign, Greg Crawford, MCAHN President, spoke to local and national media about our region's economic recovery forecasting a return to almost 80% of pre-COVID hours for 2021 and the value that a unionized workforce brings to a job site.
