Intermixed with social and networking opportunities throughout the weekend our Associate Committee members hosted a very successful trade fair providing all attendees' and guests a business resource packed session that was filled with games, prizes and much laughter. The MCAH board would like to THANK ALL MEMBERS who participated in this year's annual gathering of industry friends and associates; and hopes to see all again next year! If

you have never attended one of the MCAH annual general meetings, golf tournaments or Christmas events etc. I would encourage you to come out and participate as they provide a wonderful opportunity to network with local business partners, clients and colleagues.

As reported earlier in the year, our MCAH promotion committee directed support to "Renew Hamilton" a program of initiatives being undertaken by the Hamilton Chamber of Commerce. With The Renew Hamilton in their start-up year, their accomplishments have been many to date. In June they hosted a presentation, "Cities for People" at Hamilton City Hall which attracted a capacity audience. Their management goals are well underway having developed a sponsorship program for their "Speaker Series". They participated in the 4th Annual Transforming & Revitalizing Downtown Summit also held in June by presenting a forum on the role of creative industries in the ongoing regeneration of Hamilton's downtown and adjacent neighbourhoods, including James Street North and Locke Street.

As a representation of goodwill towards the community in which we live, work and play, the Mechanical Contractors Association of Hamilton and UA Local 67 have collaborated to make a multi-year gift of \$275,000 to the Hamilton Health Sciences Foundation to support patient care initiatives in the region. The gift is being shared across the four main sites — Hamilton General Hospital, Juravinski Hospital and Cancer Centre, McMaster Children's Hospital and St. Peter's Hospital.

If member companies are looking to select new employees check out a fantastic New "Hiring Tool" recently endorsed by MCA Ontario. Known as "Clear Fit", it is a personal evaluation system for use in the search for/hiring of management/supervisory/office personnel, at all levels of a company.

The MCAH scholarship program presented financial assistance to 20 deserving student recipients from our membership companies. These students are hardworking high achievers, accomplished community volunteers and our "leaders of the future". The MCAH annual scholarship program is in its 18th year and is held in high regard by your present board of directors as a means of providing our member company youth a valuable boost as it is as important as ever to inform youth about opportunities available to them in the unionized construction industry.

Locally and throughout the province, construction opportunities exist for the skilled trades as Ontario's economy is expected to continue to grow at a moderate pace over the next few years. The annual Ontario Construction Secretariat (OCS) survey of industrial, commercial and institutional (ICI) construction contractors reported in their March 2012 construction industry survey that the "outlook for 2012 is strong but remains lower than previous years". Several large institutional projects are underway in the Hamilton and surrounding area with ongoing and additional industrial opportunities on the horizon.

As we move towards the upcoming fall session many plans are underway relating to membership educational opportunities hosted by the MCAH and our ongoing collaborative efforts with the Canadian Mechanical Contractors Education Foundation (CMCEF). Your MCAH board of directors remains dedicated to building on our past successes, working effectively and efficiently with upcoming UA labour negotiations and any of the other challenges that lay ahead. A special welcome to Anthony DeChellis who has recently joined your MCAH 2012 board of directors.

attendee said she wet herself but still stayed till the end because she was afraid to miss anything. If you weren't present for **Simon B. Cotter's Humour in the Workplace** presentation on May12th at the MCAH AGM then you missed something truly unique. It was an incredibly funny presentation which has many applications in the business world. Cotter uses jokes and funny stories to illustrate his points as he takes the audience through the uses of Humour as a powerful business tool. Simon showed how humour can be used to generate sales, increase sales volumes, increase client loyalty, increase employee retention, reduce sick days and build company spirit. He particularly pointed out how humour can be used in a leadership role. Building cohesive business units and motivating teamwork. "For the 21st century information is the new currency. Those that make their messages more memorable are better able to sell their ideas. Humour gets people to remember you and your message." In between laughs, Simon stressed the ability of Humour to "Build bridges of communication" between colleagues and clients. After making his point he added "My wife always says communication is the most important part of any relationship.

Simon Cotter's humour is very clean and clever and reminds the listener of what Bill Cosby would be like if he were talking about business. He has the crowd in stitches especially when making fun of himself. He pointed out that most people are afraid of making fun of themselves at work because they won't be respected. He used several stories and statistics to prove the exact opposite. The most interesting thing about the presentation was how Simon showed that everyone can be funny. He then took the audience through the types of humour and how they can be applied in a business environment. There was not a dry eye in the house but the message was also profound. "Humour allows you to connect with people. In a digital age personal connections are more important than ever before. You laugh with your friends. People hate to say no to their friends" Simon made a lot of friends on May 12th. 
