In January, 2013 MCAH hosted the Dr. Hanna Productivity course to a capacity membership audience. Our industry partners offered several "Mark Breslin" events in April and September of this year to the general UA Local 67 and membership companies, with the most recent September 24th event focusing on "Positive Change". With consideration to the ongoing UA amalgamations, the event was timely, well presented and certainly kept the audience engaged! Our MCAH commitment to the annual scholarship program offered to member company employee students continued in 2013. The August 15th event this year was held at Construction House to a capacity crowd of recipients, parents and family members. The judging for the 20 scholarship recipients was arduous, as your students demonstrated remarkable achievements with their grade averages, community involvement and leadership. Once again, congratulations to all this years' recipients!

As expected, there are many ongoing issues and initiatives within our industry and 2013 has shaped up to be no exception. Prompt payment (Bill 69) changes are moving forward with MCAC continuing to stay close to the issue, assisting the National Trade Coalition of Canada whenever possible and promoting Bill 69, the Prompt Payment Act is an important issue for the contracting and Building Trades community. It appears the Bill has all parties' support. Bill 69 passed second reading in May and was referred to the Standing Committee on Regulations and Private Bills. Other interesting and noteworthy items of legislation worth monitoring as they impact unionized agreements, governance, reporting and privacy include, Bill 74 and Bill 377.

The Ontario College of Trades membership is "optional for employers of skilled tradespersons". However, the College strongly encourages all eligible individuals and businesses to become active members based on the view that success and ability to respond to the needs of the skilled trades sector depends on all voices being heard.

Our local 2013 man-hours remain strong, with the remainder of the province exhibiting spikes and lows in the various regions of Sarnia, Niagara, Sudbury, Ste. Sainte Marie and Thunder Bay. While construction employment growth remains strong in Ontario, we need to uniformly stay focused and advocate for jobs and market share that will provide a source of sustainable income in our local and outlying communities. With the strength of our membership, associate membership and industry partners, our collective voices will be heard. Participate whenever you can. I wish you all prosperity and success with all your endeavors.

The Centre opened on April 18, 2013, and is home to south-central Ontario's only neonatal ophthalmology screening program and pediatric retinal surgeon. As a leading teaching hospital, McMaster Children's Hospital also offers the region's only pediatric ophthalmology training programs for new doctors.

GROWING MIGHTY OAKS!

The Local MIAC & Labour Relations Committee innovations continue to expand noting new representation with the Hamilton Halton Construction Association Labour Relations Committee, Fair Wage Municipal Reviews, and Ontario Construction Secretariat Local Tripartite Committee. Recent years have seen industry collaborations with UA Canada, UA Local 67, MCAO and MCAC and their subcommittees, engagement is now affecting the way we do business through the development of Prompt Payment Legislation, market share analysis and programming implementation, succession planning and the introduction of industry experts and public forums.

Mark Breslin is a strategist and author of several books, including Survival of the Fittest, Alpha Dog: Leading, Managing & Motivating in the Construction Industry and, most recently, The Five Minute Foreman: Mastering the People Side of Construction www.breslin.biz (Left to Right): MCAH Director George Furness/Committee Chairman, Strategist/Author Mark Breslin and UA Local 67 Business Manager, Mark Ellerker continue to drive positive change through regular meetings and membership forums addressing our changing times and the new face of unionized construction.

In an excerpt from Mark Breslin's Growing Mighty Oaks! article..."Union workers in the construction industry are focusing on a broader understanding of the industry as a whole and their role within it. They understand the work – they know how to use the tools and understand the importance of getting the job done. When it comes to developing apprentices and new craft workers, our industry has traditionally focused on teaching and training skills. In fact, the brand identity for union workers is "highly skilled" and now the knowledge is being addressed. In a



competitive economy and industry that is rapidly evolving, knowledge is as important as skills. What kinds of knowledge do we need to continue to provide to grow mighty oaks over the years of their development?

Every apprentice and journeyman in the U.S. and Canada will need to continue to rebuild their focus on the following key components:

Market Share: Explain what it is, why it matters, and how it affects the union construction industry. Emphasize how market share impacts the individual union member and what needs to be done to ensure unionized labour.

What's Important to the Owner? Help the entire team understand the wants and needs of the construction owner – be the government, private owner, industrial, commercial or private sector. In the end everyone is working for the owner, reinforcing a unified team approach.

Why Union? Accountability and reputation. Define the union value proposition and the promises we are making to the market. Explore the consequences of what happens when we fail to deliver on those promises. Make sure each worker understands they are personally responsible for the success of every job they work on. Finances: What is the total cost of a union journeyman (fully loaded)? What is the delta between union and non-union labor costs? What are the average post-tax margins for contractors in the construction business? How do the "little things" add up to decrease margins?

Clients: Where does work come from? How do contractors bid on and procure new work? What do clients expect? Why do clients choose unionized workers? Why might they pick the competition? Why are quality and schedules so important?

Leadership: What are the key business skills contractors need and want in both current and future leaders? How do apprentices and journeymen obtain these skills to fulfill their future leadership potential?

Succession and Knowledge Transfer: How does generational change in the business impact workers personally? How might this change impact pensions? Why is mentoring so critical, both now and in the future?

Change: Emphasize the inevitability and necessity of adaptive change at an organizational, professional and personal level to remain competitive and relevant in today's world.

And these are just the start. Many think that being in the trades is only about hard work, determination and grit – and in a sense, they're right. I am a fourth-generation construction guy, and I know those qualities are absolutely essential to success on the jobsite. But we cannot ignore the fact that the hands that perform the work always follow the head and the heart."

APPRENTICE TRAINING ESTABLISHES NEW BENCHMARKS - TTA Grand Opening!



n April 2013 a new chapter of industry training was introduced in Brantford, Ontario as a result of the UA 67 Technical Trades

Academy (TTA) Grand Opening, Open House and UA Canada Central Regional Apprenticeship Competition. Dignitaries, contractors, students, industry suppliers, facilitators and partners had an opportunity to tour the 33,000 sq. ft. training facility where instructors and staff have worked diligently to provide JATC managed apprentices with "state-of-the-art hands on" skills training. Points of interest you may not be aware of include the significant investment made to the development of Pre-apprentices Training Skills before beginning their apprenticeship, hands on skills set training, the 1st Year Apprentice Plumbers are able to complete residential rough-in plumbing within 3 to 4 months of beginning their apprenticeship training; a proactive approach to preparing our Apprentice Plumbers



to use their residential plumbing knowledge as a stepping stone to commercial and institutional plumbing; many of our Apprentice Welders have also participated in our Pre-Apprenticeship Program. Once they complete that program they are immediately enrolled into 10 weeks of Level 1 Trade School and UA Training at night school. At the present time, completing the boiler and steam P.R.V. stations are underway in which new skills sets will be factored into the Apprentice Steamfitter training modules. Future plans also include a new gas lab. Integration and education!
